Overview

The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Youth Program in Jefferson County provides employment training services to low income at-risk youth. Eligible participants work with a case manager to create a personalized plan for obtaining and retention of unsubsidized employment that leads to economic self-sufficiency.

Services

Enrolled Participants can take advantage of the following 10 program elements:

- Tutoring
- GED Preparation
- Work Experience
- Summer Employment
- Alternative Education
- Leadership Activities
- Supportive Services
- Adult Mentoring
- Follow-up Services
- Referrals

Eligibility

Youth applicants must be 17-21 years old, low income or receive public assistance and have one or more of the following barriers to employment or education:

- deficient in basic literacy skills
- youthful offender
- high school drop out
- homeless/runaway
- pregnant/parenting youth
- foster care
- needs additional assistance completing an educational plan or secure employment
- LWIB defined barrier

Hours of Intake/Eligibility

Monday – Friday
8:30 am – 3:00 pm

Documents required for eligibility determination:

- Alabama Job Link (AJL) printout and resume
- Current Alabama driver's license, State ID card, Social Security card (or printout) and birth certificate for children of applicant.
- Males 18 and over must provide proof of Selective Service registration. *NOTE: If you do not have your card, verification can be obtained online at www.sss.gov.*
- Proof of income: award letters if receiving Food Stamps, TANF, Disability, SSI or Unemployment
OR
last 3 paystubs, or employer's statement documenting income for the 6 months prior to application date
- Proof of school status: high school or college transcripts, GED, I.E.P., or withdrawal letter
- Proof of barrier to employment or education (must present documentation of at least one of the listed barriers):

Note: Youth 18 and under must be accompanied by a parent/parent(s) or legal guardian. Parent/Parent(s) or legal guardian must provide the following documents: driver's license or State ID, Social Security cards and proof of income for the household.
