MALVERTISING

WHAT IS "MALVERTISING"?

MALVERTISING, REFERS TO THE PRACTICE OF DISTRIBUTING MALWARE THROUGH ONLINE ADVERTISEMENTS.

HOW TO SPOT MALVERTISING?:

- SUSPICIOUS CONTENT: MALVERTISEMENTS MAY CONTAIN ENTICING OFFERS, ALARMING MESSAGES, OR PROMPTS TO CLICK ON THEM URGENTLY. USERS SHOULD EXERCISE CAUTION WHEN ENCOUNTERING ADS THAT SEEM TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE OR CREATE A SENSE OF URGENCY.
- MISMATCHED BRANDING: PAY ATTENTION TO INCONSISTENCIES IN BRANDING, SUCH AS LOGOS, COLORS, OR FONTS, WITHIN THE ADVERTISEMENT. MALVERTISEMENTS OFTEN MIMIC LEGITIMATE ADS BUT MAY FEATURE SUBTLE DIFFERENCES THAT INDICATE THEIR MALICIOUS NATURE.
- UNUSUAL BEHAVIOR: IF AN AD BEHAVES STRANGELY, SUCH AS AUTOMATICALLY REDIRECTING THE USER TO ANOTHER WEBSITE OR INITIATING UNAUTHORIZED DOWNLOADS, IT MAY BE A SIGN OF MALVERTISING. USERS SHOULD BE WARY OF ADS THAT EXHIBIT UNEXPECTED BEHAVIOR.
